## Summary

The bill establishes the Surveillance Technology Act, creating an oversight board to regulate surveillance technology used by law enforcement in Michigan.

## Business Impact

If your organization uses surveillance technology in Michigan, you must report usage details to the oversight board semiannually or face potential scrutiny.

## Key Provisions

- Establishes the Surveillance Technology Oversight Board within the Department of State Police.
- Requires police agencies to report semiannually on surveillance technology usage.
- Board members include law enforcement representatives and public interest advocates.
- Board to review and regulate the distribution and use of surveillance technology.
- Reports to be submitted to legislative committees annually.
- Members serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses.

## Compliance Checklist

- Report surveillance technology usage and policies to the board | Who: Police agencies possessing or using surveillance technology | Penalty: Potential scrutiny or investigation for non-compliance
- Ensure compliance with board regulations on surveillance technology | Who: Police agencies and potentially private sector entities using similar technology | Penalty: Regulatory action or penalties as determined by the board
