Prohibiting the use of facial recognition technology in connection with driver's license photographs.

Passed Both Chambers

Risk: Medium

Narrow/Targeted

Last Action (Jul 29, 2014): Signed by the Governor on 7/28/2014; Chapter 0274; Effective Date 9/26/2014.

Summary

This bill prohibits the use of facial recognition technology in connection with driver's license photographs in New Hampshire.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition technology for driver's licenses in New Hampshire, you must cease its use by September 26, 2014, or face legal consequences.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits the use of facial recognition technology for driver's license photographs.
- Applies to the New Hampshire Department of Motor Vehicles.
- Effective 60 days after passage.

Compliance Checklist

- Cease the use of facial recognition technology for driver's license photographs. | Who: New Hampshire Department of Motor Vehicles. | Penalty: Legal consequences for non-compliance may apply.
