Summary

The bill requires the Attorney General to study AI use in generating police reports and issue a report with findings and recommendations.

Business Impact

If you operate a law enforcement agency in New Jersey, you must comply with AI usage guidelines by the report's release or face scrutiny.

Key Provisions

- The Attorney General must study AI use in generating police reports.
- A report must be issued within six months of the bill's effective date.
- The report will include an assessment of AI technologies and current usage.
- Recommendations for a statewide policy governing AI use will be included.
- Law enforcement officers must review AI-generated reports for accuracy.
