Creates the "automated decision systems task force" to make specific recommendations on whether and how existing state laws, regulations, programs, policies, and practices related to the use of automated decision systems should be changed to promote fairness, accountability, and transparency.

### Summary

The bill establishes an 'automated decision systems task force' to recommend changes to laws and practices for fairness and transparency in automated decision-making, including members from charitable corporations.

### Business Impact

If you use automated decision systems in New York, you must prepare for potential changes in regulations by the task force's report within 24 months.

### Key Provisions

- Creation of the 'automated decision systems task force' consisting of 15 members, including at least seven affiliated with charitable corporations.
- Task force to compile a list of existing automated decision systems used by state agencies.
- Task force to analyze privacy issues associated with automated decision systems.
- Regular public hearings to be held with documentation accessible online.
- Report to be submitted to the governor and legislature with recommendations within 24 months.
- Task force to meet no fewer than once a month.
- Task force to dissolve 60 days after submitting its report.

### Compliance Checklist

- Prepare for potential regulatory changes regarding automated decision systems. | Who: Businesses using automated decision systems in New York. | Penalty: No specified penalties, but non-compliance may lead to regulatory challenges.
