## Summary

The bill establishes a task force to study privacy concerns and regulatory approaches for facial recognition technology in New York.

## Business Impact

If you develop or use facial recognition technology in New York, you must prepare for potential regulatory changes by the task force's report in one year.

## Key Provisions

- Establishes a task force to study facial recognition technology regulation.
- Defines 'facial recognition technology' for the purposes of the act.
- Requires a report on findings to be submitted within one year.
- Task force members will not receive compensation but can claim expenses.
- Mandates state agencies to assist the task force as needed.

## Compliance Checklist

- Prepare for potential regulatory changes based on task force findings. | Who: Developers and users of facial recognition technology. | Penalty: Potential regulatory actions or restrictions based on findings.
