Prohibits the state, state agencies and departments and contractors doing business with the state, its agencies or departments from retaining facial recognition images or sharing such images with third parties without legal authorization by a court.

## Summary

Prohibits New York state entities and contractors from retaining or sharing facial recognition images without court authorization.

## Business Impact

If you contract with NY state and use facial recognition, you must obtain court approval to retain or share images.

## Key Provisions

- Section 1: Prohibits retention and sharing of facial recognition images without court authorization.
- Section 1: Extends prohibition to aggregate data from license plate readers, audio and video surveillance, and driver license photographs.
- Section 1: Allows exceptions for specifically-identified records in criminal investigations.

## Compliance Checklist

- Ensure no facial recognition images are retained or shared without court authorization. | Who: State agencies, departments, and contractors doing business with the state. | Penalty: Potential legal challenges for non-compliance.
