Summary

This bill establishes a Medicaid identification and anti-fraud biometric technology pilot program in New York, operational in one upstate and one downstate hospital.

Business Impact

If you operate a healthcare facility in New York, you must implement biometric identification for Medicaid patients by 2016 or face potential fraud penalties.

Key Provisions

- Establishes a pilot program for biometric identification in Medicaid, operational in one upstate and one downstate hospital.
- Requires biometric proof of identity for Medicaid recipients at healthcare visits.
- Mandates storage of biometric markers and visit logs.
- Includes provisions for emergency services and alternate identification methods.
- Requires program to be revenue neutral and cost neutral to providers.
- Appropriates \$600,000 for program implementation.
