Limiting the use of automatic registration plate readers, requiring a search warrant for data from an automatic registration plate reader or security camera, and providing a penalty.

Summary

AB576 limits the use of ALPRs and security cameras, requiring a search warrant for data access. Details on penalties and exceptions require the full bill text.

Business Impact

If you use ALPRs, you must obtain a search warrant for data access or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Creation of statute 86.107 to limit the use of automatic registration plate readers.
- Creation of statute 968.376 requiring a search warrant for accessing data from ALPRs and security cameras.
- Provision of penalties for non-compliance related to both ALPRs and security cameras, though specifics cannot be confirmed without the full bill text.

Compliance Checklist

- Obtain a search warrant before accessing data from ALPRs or security cameras. | Who: Law enforcement agencies. | Penalty: Penalties for unauthorized access to data.
